### **October, An Extraordinary Month of Mission:**

Pope Francis has declared that October 2019 will be a special month of prayer and action to strengthen and grow God's mission through the Church. We are encouraged to develop our own personal mission statement, e.g. 'My Mission' could be a simple act of kindness, like visiting an elderly neighbour or it could be a bigger gesture, like volunteering or supporting a good work or charity. Whatever your mission is, share it with others around the world and celebrate that. No matter where we are, our faith connects us as one Church family. You can reach out and share God's love in your daily life by Facebook, Twitter or Instagram and share your personal mission using the hashtags #MyMission and #EMM2019.

We shall have a *Mass For The Evangelization Of Peoples* on **Saturday, 26 October, at 10am**, (with the recitation of the rosary at 9.30am) followed by tea & coffee. If you have any particular missionary intention you would like to pray for please pass them to Fr M or the parish office and they can be included in the Mass. Thank you.

**October** is also known as **the month of the Holy Rosary**, which the Church celebrates with particular devotion. It is considered a powerful weapon against evil, as well as the perfect prayer to bring peace to the world. The rosary is prayed publicly before the Sunday morning 10am Mass and on Tuesday evenings and Friday mornings. Why not come along a little earlier during the month or simply join in when you arrive?
