Opening St Joseph's church for public worship: I would like to invite any who wish to help with cleaning & stewarding to a meeting at the church (appropriately socially distanced) this Monday, 29 June, at 7.00pm, where we can discuss what we need to do and how we are to do it. We will still have to pass the diocesan inspection before we can open. You can be accepted as a volunteer if:

- You are well
- Nobody in your household has coronavirus symptoms, for example a cough or high temperature
- You are under 70
- You do not have any long-term health conditions that make them vulnerable to coronavirus.

There is a **National Weekly Mass**, celebrated by a bishop in his cathedral, taking place **each Thursday evening at 7.00pm** for the sick in hospital, their families and the front-line health care workers as a focus of our Catholic community support. Archbishop Wilson is to celebrate, **this Thursday**, **2 July**, from Southwark cathedral. The Mass can be followed on Livestream.

St Joseph's school has been open throughout the lockdown for children of keyworkers. **Please be aware**, if you are visiting the cemetery (also open throughout lockdown), that there will be a short period from 8:50am in the morning and 2:55pm in the afternoon when Year 6 pupils will be entering and leaving the school via the cemetery gate. As social-distancing rules still apply, it would be good to avoid any traffic jams! This will only be Mon/Tues and Thurs/Fri.
