What things can Simon do as a Deacon?

A permanent deacon is asked to act as an icon of Christ the servant and he may serve the Lord's visible body the Church, and be Christ's herald in the world, as a minister of the Altar, Word and Charity. His tasks include:

The Altar

Assisting the priest at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist

Presiding at a celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism

Presiding at a celebration of the Sacrament of Matrimony (with the appropriate delegation)

Presiding at a Funeral Service (including Burials & Cremations) Presiding at Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament Bringing the Holy Eucharist to the sick at home, in hospitals and other institutions

Assisting in the formation of Altar Servers and Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist

The Word

Proclaiming the holy Gospel at the Liturgy

Preaching a homily

Announcing the General Intercessions (a deacon should read the bidding prayers at any Mass at which he is assisting)

Participating in Sacramental preparation programmes

Assisting in the formation of Readers

Facilitating study of, and prayer with, the Scriptures

Holy Charity

Visiting the sick and the bereaved Promoting awareness of the Catechism of the Church Promoting awareness of the social and moral teaching of the Church Assisting in the development of the lay apostolate The promotion of justice
