St Joseph's School Readings & Carols Service will be on Tuesday, 20 December, at 2.00pm in church and their End of Term Mass in church will be on Thursday, 22 December, also at 2.00pm. All are welcome.

Children's Liturgy at the Sunday 10.00am Mass: This is for any child who has started Reception Class or is in Year One, Two or Three. We follow a new safeguarding measure, which keeps a weekly record of which children and liturgy leaders attend. Before Mass you simply need to add your child's name and date of birth to a list that the liturgy leader will have at the back of church. Children who are taking part are invited to follow the procession to the altar at the beginning of the Mass before they then proceed to the undercroft. A Reverse Advent Calendar for St Wilfrid's 2022

Give rather than receive each day in Advent. All you need to do is: 1. Get a bag 2. Add an item into the bag from the list below each day 3. Deliver the bag to St Wilfrid's - after 4 January - or leave them at the back of the church (Any volunteers please to help deliver them?). Items are used throughout the year. You can drop off items at the Centre, (Mon-Fri 9am – 5pm) and you can telephone 255 5720 for more information.

The centre has a 7 to 3 ratio of male to female clients, and the items that are needed include: Toiletries: soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, deodorant, incl. toothbrushes, combs, hairbrushes, Clothing, incl. men's underwear (boxer shorts M/L/XL), women's pants - all sizes, hats, gloves, scarves, Food: boxes/tins of individually wrapped chocolates. Other items useful throughout the year include: tinned meat & fish: tuna, casserole, stewing steak, tinned vegetables: potatoes, peas & carrots, tomatoes, tinned rice pudding & custard, jars of pickles, Drinks: cordials, hot chocolate, Store cupboard items: brown sauce, salad cream (not glass), pot noodles & cupa-soups.

Gaudete Sunday

The third Sunday of Advent takes its name (Gaudete, i.e. Rejoice) from the first word of the Introit (Entrance antiphon) at Mass. The season of Advent evolved as a fast of forty days in preparation for Christmas, commencing on the day after the feast of St. Martin (12 November), and it was often called "St. Martin's Lent" - a name by which it was known as early as the fifth century. In the ninth century, the duration of Advent was reduced to four weeks and by the twelfth century the fast had been replaced by simple abstinence. Pope St. Gregory the Great (d. 604 A.D.) was the first to draw up an Office for the Advent season, and the Gregorian Sacramentary is the earliest to provide Masses for the Sundays of Advent. So, for much of this period, Advent preserved the characteristics of a penitential season which made it a kind of counterpart to Lent, and the middle (or third) Sunday corresponded with Laetare or the mid-Lent fourth Sunday. As on Laetare Sunday, the organ and flowers, forbidden during the rest of the season, were permitted to be used and rose-coloured vestments were allowed instead of purple (or black, as formerly). Gaudete Sunday therefore, signifies the nearness of the Lord's coming and the Church no longer invites us to adore merely The Lord who is to come, but calls upon us to worship and hail with joy The Lord who is now nigh and close at hand.
