

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The feast of Our Lady of Lourdes on Wednesday, 11 February, is also the occasion of the annual World Day of Prayer for the Sick. This is an observation that was introduced by Pope St John Paul II as a way for believers to offer their prayers for those suffering from illnesses. This means that **the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be offered at the conclusion of this weekend's Saturday Vigil and Sunday Masses.**

This weekend, 7 & 8 February, sees the annual retiring collection for the diocesan Sick and Retired Clergy Fund. Our contribution helps contribute to the care of the priests of the diocese who are currently sick or retired. On top of the annual diocesan assessment (£20,524.00 in December last year), the diocese now levy's a further separate charge for this fund upon parishes. Our levy was £5020.00 last year (December 2025). Please therefore be as generous as you can in support of our sick and retired clergy who have spent their lives in service of the diocese and the People of God.

Palm Sunday, 29 March, **Holy Week begins.**

Easter Sunday, 5 April, The Resurrection of the Lord.

Ash Wednesday, 18 February, is a Day of Fasting & Abstinence: everyone aged 14 years and older must abstain from consuming meat, while everyone aged from 18 to 59 must fast unless they are exempt (usually for a medical reason). Regardless of age, everyone is encouraged to observe the spirit of the day and to assume some form of penance. Masses are at 10.00am & 7.00pm.

The Season of Lent

During his life on earth Our Lord undertook voluntary penance, e.g. the Forty Days in the desert, and he invited us all to do the same. Our penance can therefore be offered spiritually as a share in his own suffering, especially in his blessed Passion and Death. Christian penance is also an expression of inner conversion and a form of reparation for sin, it should be a personal action or sacrifice offered in love for God and neighbour. Following Christ means we must always practise some form of penance and devote ourselves in a particular way to prayer, self-denial and works of charity.

- From 21 February, On the **Saturdays of Lent** there will be **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament & Confessions** from 10.00am to 11.00am, with Benediction at 10.50am.
- There will also, starting that same day, be **Stations of the Cross on the Saturdays of Lent** at 4.15pm.
- From 22 February, On the **Sundays of Lent** there will be **Stations of the Cross** after the 10.00am Mass.
- From 23 February, for the **Mondays of Lent, Mass** will be **at 7.15am**.
- On **30 & 31 March**, the Monday and Tuesday of Holy Week, at **3.15pm to 4.15pm** there will be two sessions of **after-school Confessions**.
- On, **1 April**, the Wednesday of Holy Week, **St Joseph's School** will perform their **Passion Play** in church at 2.00pm. All welcome.

Stations of the Cross: I would like to encourage people to feel free to pray this Lenten devotion before or after Mass should you wish. It is a lovely sight to see people meandering around a church in prayer and a simple prayer at each Station is all that is required (although the traditional format is very popular there is no set or series of necessary prayers that you must say).
